FROM T.O. WILLIAMS, PRESIDENT: We will have a Board meeting following the regular meeting on June 10.

FROM CARL MCDANIELS AND MICHELLE BRAUNS: Free Clinic Tours. Since the group has an interest in our mission and is a current supporter, I wanted to touch base and provide information about our formal tours because I would love to schedule Rotarians to see the Clinic in Christiansburg. We hold twice-monthly, one-hour tours of the Clinic for community members. We had a tour on Wed., June 2 from 8 – 9 a.m. Upcoming tour is Thursday, June 17 from 4 – 5 p.m. The tours are held similarly each month – the first Wednesday in the morning and 3rd Thursday in the afternoon. Or, I'm happy to give you a tour when it's convenient for the group. We are limited to about 10-12 in each group. I think most people are amazed at the number of programs we are able to provide simply on the power of volunteers. We have an incredible need in this community for this service – we see over 3,000 patients each year and provide an average of three visits for each of those patients to our medical, dental or pharmacy programs. Even with national healthcare reform, nothing about what we do will change federally until 2014 and even then, the changes are incremental until 2019. We anticipate the need for free medical care to continue for a long time.

FROM FRANKLYN MORENO, GROUP STUDY EXCHANGE (GSE): GSE is a program of the Rotary Foundation and is a Cultural and Vocational Exchange Program for young professionals which is designed to develop professional and leadership skills. GSE is one program of The Rotary Foundation in which every Rotarian can be a direct participant. You can volunteer to be one of two team leaders are selected from our membership to lead teams abroad each year. You can make a potentially life changing gift to someone by nominating them to be a GSE team member. Finally, you can volunteer to host an incoming team member for 4-7 days.

A **GSE Team** is made up of a **Rotarian Team Leader** and Four (4) **Non-Rotarian Team Members**. meals, sightseeing and vocational observation opportunities to the visiting team. Our District will host Two (2) Teams in 2010 - 2011. The exchanges will be made with **District 9830 in Tasmania (Australia)** and **District 4690 in Bolivia**. Rotary pays for the most economical round trip ticket between the Home District and Host District.

All of the applications, brochures, etc. are on the district website under the DISTRICT tab. You may need to scroll down to get to the GSE portion. Deadline for Team Leader Applications for Tasmania and Bolivia is **Sept 3, 2010**. Deadline for Team Member applications is Oct. 1, 2010.

FROM GREG LEMMOND, YARD SALE COMMITTEE: Hello all! In preparing for our annual yard sale, there are a few “strategy” issues we can think about now – please let me know what you think.

1. In the past, we have included used clothing in our yard sales. More recently, we have been known for being the “No Clothes” (wink) yard sale. What do you think? In your experience with yard sales, what are the pros and cons of including used clothing? What do you recommend this year?
2. The hours of set up at (or before) dawn on the day of the yard sale can be hectic/chaotic. Perhaps that is part of the fun, but here’s an idea: We can have space inside the YMCA Storeroom by the door where we could sort items out the day before (kitchen items in one pile, books in another, etc, etc). Would you be willing to allocate an hour on Friday afternoon/evening to help with something like that?
3. Are you willing to ask a neighbor, co-worker, or business contact if they have any office or home furniture that we can haul away for them? As I understand it, we do have tax paperwork that we can furnish. Please consider business contacts with office renovations in the works, as well as realtors/property managers who may know of household “left behinds” in good condition.
4. Based on your experiences at past yard sales, what would you like to ensure stays the same with this one? What changes would you like to see?

The need for blood is increasing in all parts of the world, and young people can make an important contribution by donating blood and recruiting others to become donors. Many activities are planned around the world to highlight the role of young people in ensuring a safe blood supply. Learn more on the World Blood Donor Day website. Rotary specific-materials have been provided by the Global Network for Blood Donation, a Rotarian Action Group. Those that can give are encouraged to do so. Also, you'll get make-up credit. It takes about an hour for whole Blood, about an hour and a half for double reds (equal to 2 whole blood donations but just the red blood cells) and about the length of time of a feature film to donate platelets.
